Streetscape & Public Places

Objectives

Letterkenny has its own special character, with streetscapes, public open spaces, history, traditions and building styles that make up its unique identity. The objectives of this category are:

- Protect and improve the physical and environmental fabric and character of the town.
- Protect and enhance the streetscape.
- Conservation and presentation of heritage buildings and sites.
- Enhancing public amenities; and
- General presentation and quality of the area to include the presentation of buildings and shop fronts.

Priorities

For Letterkenny key streetscapes include Port Road, Lower Main Street, Main Street, Upper Main Street, Church Lane, and the Market Square. A key priority for Letterkenny Tidy Towns is the enhancement of the main shopping streets by:

- De-cluttering the streetscape.
- Improving key sites and structures.
- Protecting the character of the area from inappropriate development, including poor signage.
- Supporting the restoration of heritage buildings.

- Lobbying for improvements on unsightly and derelict buildings in key areas of the town.
- Increasing awareness of and the access to information on the rich local history and built heritage of the area.
- Maximising the benefit of local amenities; and
- Improving pedestrian linkages between key sites and amenities.

What we do

We work to ensure that the streets, buildings, and public spaces that encompass the physical spaces of Letterkenny are appropriate, well maintained, fit for purpose and accessible for all.

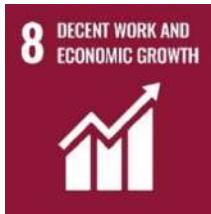

Greenspaces & Landscaping

Objectives

The objectives of this category are to enhance the appearance and environment of the area through appropriate landscaping and planting and to maximise the availability, quality, and amenity value of public open spaces. The importance of access to our green spaces and nature for physical and mental health has been starkly highlighted in recent times. Ensuring we have quality greenspaces and landscaped area to enjoy in Letterkenny is important to us.

Priorities

Letterkenny has a wide range of open spaces to enjoy from lush green parks to wildflower verges. Key priorities are the maintenance and enhancement of our existing open spaces with include:

- **Bernard McGlinchey Park**
- **Ballymacool Park**
- **Ballyboe Park**
- **Famine Garden**
- **Linear Park**

We have an extensive programme of planting, undertake landscaping improvements of open spaces, maintain, and enhance key open green spaces in the town and develop additional public greenspaces, where possible. The presentation and maintenance of key roundabouts in the town is also important in this category.






What we do

We do this through collaboration with Donegal County Council and other stakeholders and through participation in the Community Employment (CE) Scheme. Currently Letterkenny TidyTowns has 15 CE Scheme workers and 2 DLDC TUS workers participating in TidyTowns related work throughout the town. TidyTowns volunteers also work to add value and enhance green spaces throughout Letterkenny.

Nature & Biodiversity on Our Area

Objectives

The objectives of this category are to ensure there is an understanding of the nature and biodiversity present in the local area, how it is protected and sensitively enhanced. TidyTown groups should demonstrate appreciation of the most ecologically valuable areas and ensure that any work carried out under the auspices of TidyTown will never have a negative impact on these. We also have an onus to share our knowledge and awareness of local nature and biodiversity with the wider community.

Our Key Habitats

Water habitats

These are among the most important and probably the most sensitive of habitat types in any area. Letterkenny is situated at the southern end of Lough Swilly, one of the longest inlets in Ireland. The River Swilly is another key habitat that we need to protect and enhance.

Woodlands, Treelines and Hedgerows

Mature trees and especially woodlands are among the most valuable habitat types for nature in any area. Long-lived and stable wooded areas provide year-round food and shelter for a surprising range of species from plants, fungi and invertebrates to birds and mammals. Treelines and hedgerows are also valuable 'commuting' habitat for birds and bats.


Buildings and Stone Walls

We have many examples of these habitats. Stonework can be home to a wide variety of lichens, ferns, and plants.

Parks and Open Spaces with Pollinator Patches

We are fortunate to have a variety of parklands and amenity grassland in and around our town. We continue to support the All Ireland Pollinator Plan in relation to biodiversity enhancement through wildflower meadow creation.

Our Key Priorities



Knowing and understanding nature and biodiversity, habitats, and species in and around Letterkenny.

Actions for nature and biodiversity.

Awareness raising.

What we do

We incorporate wildlife and biodiversity considerations into our activities, such as planting and landscaping, undertaking relevant research, information, and promotional projects. We support relevant activities by other groups and schools in the town. We have created a habitat map that indicates the location and extent of the habitats and biodiversity areas in Letterkenny.

We have been supporting the All Ireland Pollinator Plan since 2020 and have developed a programme to increase our support year on year through the life of the Pollinator Plan till 2025. Over the past few years, we have embraced planting for pollinators and are bringing the Council and residents along with us on the transition.

Yearly Actions

1. We facilitate visits of expert speakers to the schools to increase participation and awareness.
2. We hold wildlife observation competition with the local schools, feeding into the National Biodiversity Centre campaigns.
3. Promotion of Biodiversity Week – ‘Don’t mow let it grow’.
4. We promote the ‘Grow your own Pollinators’ programme to encourage the growing of pollinator friendly plants.
5. We run a Pollinator Tree “Buy one get one half price” promotion with Alcorn’s Garden Centre in October yearly.

Biodiversity Action Plans

This year we seek to develop a comprehensive Biodiversity Action Plan for a variety of habitats within the town. To enhance biodiversity in any area, quite often what is needed is to examine what already exists, realise the local potential and quite literally, fill the gaps.

We have been working with locals to develop their biodiversity mapping skills over the past few years. We have identified three sites where Biodiversity Action Plans are required:

Sentry Hill has a mix of small grassland habitats with a shrub layer behind and borders a local school with their own habitat mix.

Ballyrairie Park has several different trees, both native and non-native in a grassland habitat with much potential for enhancement.

Roger’s Burn is a small stream with associated riparian habitat which feeds in to the Swilly River and ultimately, Lough Swilly. Riparian habitats are an excellent example of natural corridors and can play an essential role in habitat connectivity.

By connecting existing habitats, decreasing the fragmentation that development can bring and delivering a series of affordable, practical and in a lot of cases, simple actions, the town and surrounding area could significantly increase the biodiversity that is already here. Quite often, the simplest thing to help biodiversity is to do less, manage less and leave room for nature to plug the gaps itself. However, a certain element of management is required in some cases.

Sustainability, Doing More with Less

Sustainability means meeting our own needs without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.

Objectives

Sustainable communities are those that promote sustainable living to residents and aim to generate minimal environmental impact. This is beneficial to all, as sustainable communities are economically thriving, environmentally healthy and socially resilient.

Priorities

Our priorities in this category are to:

- Encourage residents and businesses to give more thought to our daily behaviours including our waste generation, water consumption, energy usage, material usage etc.
- Support the Shop Local campaign run by the Letterkenny Chamber of Commerce.
- Reuse more, recycle more materials of higher quality and if we can't do that recovering energy from waste, in line with the waste hierarchy.
- Require and get more information on the products and services we buy.
- Consider how energy efficient or eco-efficient are our purchasing choices.









What we do

We work with and collaborate with various organisations in the town in relation to various sustainability issues. For example, in September 2019 we launched the 'Go Green' environmental campaign in collaboration with the Letterkenny Chamber. Go Green will play its part in keeping Letterkenny tidy, encouraging customers to #GoGreen in their everyday lives and promotes Letterkenny as a greener retail destination. The launch of the campaign involved some exciting events, collaborations, and competitions.

We support the local authority Environmental Awareness Officer working together on local green initiatives.

Residential Streets & Houses

Objectives

The objectives of this category largely embrace those outlined in earlier categories, but with specific reference to residential areas. Private dwellings along approach roads, within residential estates and within the town centre are assessed on the presentation and maintenance of individual buildings including their gable walls, rear façades, roadside boundary walls / fencing, together with their private open space. Public open spaces within residential estates are also considered and include their range of functions as well as their maintenance and presentation.

Priorities

Key priorities include the upkeep of open spaces in housing areas, with particular emphasis on mobilising action through individual residents' associations.

What we do

We work on projects related to litter and tidiness with emphasis on residential areas and open spaces within housing areas. We place particular emphasis on mobilising action through individual residents' associations. We have strong support from several active residents'

associations in the town. We reward efforts in our annual Cleaner Community Awards.

Some of our actions

- Cleaner Community Campaign.
- Support Residents Associations by encouraging participation in Cleaner Community Campaign Competition.
- Showcase residential projects.
- Continue to work closely with the Cathedral Quarter Committee to regenerate the historical Church Lane and to create a real hidden treasure for tourists in the heart of Letterkenny.
- Pollinator friendly trees – we worked with a local garden centre to offer a discount to anyone purchasing a tree so long as they provide their Eircode. We intend to map where these trees have been planted to feed into our biodiversity map of Letterkenny. This was a great success for us and therefore we intend to run it again in Autumn 2023.
- A rotation of Letterkenny Tidy Towns 'Helping Hand' teams to visit estates to be set up to carry out brief but regular and focused tasks in selected estates.

Approach Roads, Streets & Lanes

Objectives

This category considers all aspects of approach roads, streets, and lanes. First impressions of the town can be strongly influenced by the appearance and condition of its approach roads, therefore maintaining approach roads to a good standard is particularly important under this category. Furthermore, the road network in our towns facilitate the movement of cars, public transport vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians. As a result, the appearance, functionality, and the convenience that roads, streets, and lanes offer motorists, cyclists and pedestrians are primary considerations under this category.

Priorities

Key priorities include litter management, addressing tidiness issues, the management of verges and open spaces on approach roads and engagement with the local authority and other stakeholders to address issues relating to approach roads and streets and lanes.

What we do

We work with national and local authority to address issues relating to approach roads and streets.

Some of our actions

- Monitor illegal signs and to lobby Donegal County Council to have a co-ordinated and consistent approach to signage on approach roads and within the town centre.
- Monitor vacant sites on approach roads for illegal dumping and graffiti.
- Encourage a balanced management of tidiness and protection of wildlife habitat protection to our approach roads.
- Participate in Donegal County Council Approach Road Scheme and Adopt a Road Scheme.
