This plan is to be used to guide the work of our committee and volunteers over the next 3 years of our Tidy Towns efforts. This plan sets out a number of Key Projects that we believe will have the greatest impact on our town over this period. We have included an approximate timeframe for these projects. The plan then sets out year by year the projects and initiatives that we will strive to undertake over the lifetime of this plan. Finally, a number of annual and ongoing tasks are given that are central to our ongoing work here in Letterkenny.

How Was This Plan Developed ?



This plan was developed by Letterkenny Tidy Towns with the assistance of Flynn Furney Environmental Consultants. A period of consultation included one-toone meetings and exchange of information. Walkover surveys of the town were also carried out by the consultants.

The consultants then met with our committee to hear from them what they felt was needed for the plan. The consultants then contacted representatives of all the Letterkenny schools, as well as key members of Donegal County Council, who were asked to complete a simple survey on their work and Letterkenny Tidy Towns.

Finally, the Tidy Towns Committee arranged a roundtable consultation event attended by Tidy Towns volunteers, residents, local authority staff, and our committee. All these consultation steps provided the information to put together this plan.

Letterkenny and The Sustainable Development Goals

This is Letterkenny – Seo é Leitir Ceanainn

Letterkenny is the principal town of County Donegal, with a population of just over 22.5 thousand, making it the main population center of this Ulster county. It is located at the mouth of the River Swilly, where it discharges into Lough Swilly. The uneven topography of the town with some steep hills is reflected in its Irish name Leitir Ceanainn – the hillside of the O'Canannains, a clan which was once royalty in this part of Donegal.

The town owes much of its appearance today to the Plantation of Ulster, which established Letterkenny as a market town. The streetscape still reflects this, with the Market Square being a key focal point of the town. It remains an important commercial center, with Main Street always bustling with many long-established retail premises. Numerous large retailers now operate away from Main Street in shopping centers and the Letterkenny Retail Park.

The town boasts seven primary schools and four secondary schools, as well as hosting a center of the Atlantic Technological University (ATU).

Letterkenny has a long and proud history of involvement in Tidy Towns, being a Gold Medal holder every year since the inception of Gold Medals in 2003 and leading the county's high achievers for decades. It won the overall award in 2015 and has also represented Ireland in the Entente Florale competition, where it received a Gold Medal.

VOLUNTEER DATABASE & ROSTER

This project will see the setting up of a smart database for communicating with and keeping track of volunteers. This will also inform volunteers where work is going on and what needs doing and when. A GIS application such as MyMaps may be used to allow volunteers to upload spatial information such as what areas have been recently done and where work is needed.

SHOPFRONT FOCUS

The traditional shopfronts of Letterkenny are a great asset to the town's streetscape. These are to be promoted by the Tidy Towns through a range of initiatives. These may include an exhibition of shopfronts - displayed in shopfronts, a workshop on traditional sign-writing and a publication on best practice for shopfronts.







PLANTS FOR POLLINATORS

Letterkenny Tidy Towns will make a significant move toward pollinator-friendly planting within all of its planting schemes. Over this period, Tidy Towns will track the extent of this progress and identify new opportunities for both places and plants as they arise.

Our target will be to have >90% of our planting schemes using plants for pollinators by the end of 2027.







HERBICIDE-FREE WEED CONTROL

This project will involve Letterkenny Tidy Towns undertake a novel trial of weed control measures that will not include any chemical herbicides. We will work with 3rd-level students of ATU to devise a trial structure in an area of the town where ongoing weed control is needed. We will make the findings of our project freely available to other Tidy Towns groups.









GROWING SKILLS FOR VOLUNTEERS

In order to address the need for wider horticultural knowledge among our volunteer cohort, we will arrange for a series of practical workshops that will impart the key skills for planning, planting and maintaining our green spaces. These will be made open to all of our volunteers and supporters. Following these, the trained volunteers will be able to lead gardening teams on our work days.



7 Key Project. Nature and Biodiversity in Your Locality





LOCAL BIODIVERSITY ACTION PLAN

A Letterkenny Biodiversity Action Plan is planned which will set out appropriate, locally based actions for the conservation, management and/or enhancement of habitats for the benefit of native species. This biodiversity action plan will set out a programme of ambitious yet practical actions with a focus on biodiversity enhancement for a 3-year period which the Tidy Towns group and wider community can aim to achieve.

THE LETTERKENNY BIODIVERSITY GUIDE

One of the outcomes of the Biodiversity Action Plan will be a useful guide to biodiversity projects and initiatives. This will be a practical 'toolkit' for worthwhile and doable actions for biodiversity that may be undertaken at home, at school or in a club. This will be made available online and may also be produced in print.



9 Key Project. Sustainability – Doing More With Less





FOCUS ON LOUGH SWILLY

This is a large protected site that is on our doorstep here in Letterkenny. There are at least five of the most important habitats in Europe to be found here. The lough is also a significant site for Otters and Harbour Porpoise. Throughout the duration of this plan, we will help to raise awareness of the importance of Lough Swilly and work with partners such as LAWPRO and Swilly Greenway to highlight ways that we can all protect and develop water and wetland habitats such as this.





LETTERKENNY LOCAL CLIMATE ACTION

Throughout the lifespan of this plan and beyond, Letterkenny Tidy Towns will commit to undertaking and supporting actions that will reduce our dependency on fossil fuels, lower emissions of greenhouse gases and promote awareness of the urgency of climate change. We will strive to build capacity to improve carbon literacy and the education of all stakeholders.



11 Key Project. Residential Streets and Housing Areas



ESTATES BIODIVERSITY NETWORK

Estates often offer ample space for useful biodiversity projects. However, if numerous estates undertake a project the results may be multiple. Letterkenny Tidy Towns proposes that every participating estate takes on a biodiversity project (e.g. a mini-pond or bug hotel) that would be constructed and managed by children and young adults.







THE RESIDENTS' HANDBOOK

This novel project will see the creation of a really useful guide for Letterkenny residents. It will contain key contacts, dates and addresses. However, it will also include recycling information, tips on composting, lists of wildlife-friendly plants, suitable trees for estates, water conservation and energy-saving measures in the home.

13 Key Project. Approach Roads, Streets and Lanes





SIGNPOSTING THE WAY

Many car journeys undertaken in Letterkenny are unnecessary. If people knew how close some of the key attractions were, they would walk. This project will plan and erect friendly signage that lets people know how far their journey would be on foot and how much time it is likely to take.





17 PARTINERSHIPS FOR THE GOALS

LETTERKENNY COMMUNITY APP

It is proposed that the Letterkenny Tidy Towns joins with other community groups to create a community app. This will allow groups, clubs, schools and the local authority disseminate information of community interest as well as a forum for volunteers.
